

# WEEK 12 DAY 1 Jesus' Temptation

REVIEW: After Jesus was born as a human, He grew up. This week's Bible story and the stories that happen before and after it have to do with Jesus getting ready for His ministry on earth. We learned a few weeks past that Jesus obeyed God by being baptized. Baptism is a picture of the death and resurrection of Jesus, and those who believe in Him are baptized to show the world they belong to Jesus. Last week, we specifically looked at the death and resurrection of Jesus. He was arrested and put to death even though He had never sinned, and He rose again to prove death was defeated. Jesus' resurrection gives us hope for eternal life. This week's Bible story is about "Jesus' Temptation." Let's find out what happened.

Step 1: Watch

Step 2: Discuss Story

- What does the word "tempt" mean? (to entice or attempt to entice someone to do or acquire something that they find attractive but know to be wrong or not beneficial)
- Where was Jesus led, and by whom?
- Who was he tempted by?
- Do you remember who else was tempted by the devil? (yes, Adam and Eve sin entered the world and everything changed. Jesus came to save us, and the devil didn't want him to succeed)

#### Step 4: Pray

Ask for everyone to share a prayer request and something they want to thank the Lord for, and then take turns praying out loud.

# WEEK 12 DAY 2 Jesus' Temptation

Step 1: Read

Matthew 4:1-4 https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Matthew+4%3A1-4&version=ESV

Luke 4:1-4 https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Luke+4%3A1-4&version=ESV

#### Step 2: Discuss Story

- How long had Jesus been fasting? How hungry do you think he felt?
- How did the devil temp Jesus in these verses?
- Why would it have been wrong for Jesus to turn the stones into loaves (see curriculum note below)
- How did Jesus respond?

#### Step 3: Review

Memory Verse: John 3:30 "He must increase, but I must decrease."

Big Picture Question: Why did Jesus become human? Jesus became human to obey His Father's plan and rescue sinners.

**Step 4:** Worship – listen and sing along to "We Hunger and Thirst", think about what it means to hunger and thirst for God. <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=jq9i98gBL0A">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=jq9i98gBL0A</a>

#### Step 5: Pray

Ask for everyone to share a prayer request and something they want to thank the Lord for, and then take turns praying out loud. Pray about how you can decrease, so that God can increase.

#### **Curriculum Notes**

It is not usually sin to make bread, but the devil wanted Jesus to stop obeying God. Jesus was in the wilderness without food because that is what God's Spirit told Jesus to do. If Jesus had chosen to use His power to make stones into bread, He would have been disobeying God. Jesus never used His power to satisfy His human desires. He used His power only to glorify God.



# WEEK 12 DAY 3 Jesus' Temptation

Step 1: Read

Step 2: Discuss Story

- How was the devil temping Jesus in these verses?
- How did the devil try to use scripture to trick Jesus?
- How might the devil be doing that in peoples lives today?
- How did Jesus respond?

Step 3: Review

Memory Verse: John 3:30 "He must increase, but I must decrease."

Big Picture Question: Why did Jesus become human? Jesus became human to obey His Father's plan and rescue sinners.

Step 5: Pray

Ask for everyone to share a prayer request and something they want to thank the Lord for, and then take turns praying out loud. Ask God to call to mind the truth when you might be tempted to believe lies about who He is, or who you are.

#### **Curriculum Notes**

Why is it important to know God's word? We are often tempted when we believe lies about God our ourselves. Knowing God's word and treasuring it in our hearts can help us stand up against temptation. Each time Jesus obeyed God, He used a Bible passage to resist the devil's tricks.



## WEEK 12 DAY 4 Jesus' Temptation

Step 1: Read

Step 2: Discuss Story

- In these verses, where did the devil take Jesus?
- How is he tempting Jesus?
- Again, how does Jesus respond?
- What would Jesus have avoided if he'd given into this temptation? (A torturous death on the cross)
- What would that have cost us? (Being saved from our sins, eternal life with God)

#### Step 3: Review

Memory Verse: John 3:30 "He must increase, but I must decrease."

Big Picture Question: Why did Jesus become human? Jesus became human to obey His Father's plan and rescue sinners.

**Step 4:** Worship – listen and sing along to Matt Maher's "Lord I Need You" https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=e37m3I5eH8g

#### Step 5: Pray

Ask for everyone to share a prayer request and something they want to thank the Lord for, and then take turns praying out loud and thanking God that we are no longer slaves to sin.

#### **Curriculum Notes**

The Bible says that before we trust in Jesus, we are slaves to sin. Sin has power over us. Jesus came to be the perfect sacrifice required to take away sin. He died on the cross and rose again to free us from sin and to give us the power to say no to temptation. That is such great news! Everyone who trusts in Jesus is a new creation. God forgives our sin and gives us new hearts that love and want to obey God. God also sends the Holy Spirit to live in us and fill us with His power. We will still be tempted to sin, but with the Holy Spirit we can choose to obey God.



# WEEK 12 DAY 5 Jesus' Temptation

Step 1: Read

Mark 1:12-13 https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Luke+4%3A5-8+&version=ESV

Step 2: Discuss Story

- This passage is a very short summary of Jesus' temptation what details does it mention?
- What else does this passage mention Jesus was with, and how might that have made him more vulnerable?
   (wild animals)
- "Being tempted" indicates that the temptations happened over the 40-day period, and were not limited to the 3 temptations we've learned about this week. Talk about other ways Jesus might have been tempted?
- Scripture tells us that Jesus was tempted in every way, but was without sin. How does it help you to know that Jesus has felt every temptation that you encounter?

#### Step 3: Review

Memory Verse: John 3:30 "He must increase, but I must decrease."

Big Picture Question: Why did Jesus become human? Jesus became human to obey His Father's plan and rescue sinners.

**Step 4:** Worship – listen and sing along to Hillsong's "The Lord's Prayer"

#### Step 5: Pray


Ask for everyone to share a prayer request and something they want to thank the Lord for, and then take turns praying out loud and thanking God that he can sympathize with every temptation you face.

- Collect food to donate to people who are hungry. Talk about how making good decisions is hard when you are hungry, but Jesus was hungry and did not sin.





#### **FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:**


- What is temptation?




