A bunch of junior high teenagers get together and it is Friday night. Chatter and exuberance reigns. They take the ferry and go to downtown Seattle. They jump in vans and cruise the streets. The teens are looking for people, special people. It is a search and rescue operation in which these teens look for people on the outside. These special people are outside home, outside their families, outside the mainstream and outside their own resources. The sincere greeting of a youth, a simple conversation or prayer may, for a few minutes, move a special person from outside to inside the human family.
