Real Christmas Jon and Katie Bonker: Jon writes “It’s been a pretty sweet season for us. God has been bringing more people into our lives who aren’t believers in Jesus yet. Several are women that Katie has been building relationships with (somehow between everything else she does as a mom of four and homeschooling!). It’s been a fun season of opening up our house... and allowing people to just enter into the chaos and glory and mess that is our lives. We hope and believe they have been able to see Jesus in small ways. Some of these friends are Bangladeshis, others are not. There is a small group of them that are actually from another country in the Middle East that is far more unreached than even the country we serve in. They are students at a local international university in our city. While we were sharing a meal with them, Katie asked if they had ever met any other Christians in their life. All four of them said no. All they knew about Christians was that we celebrate Christmas. So, we decided to have a little Christmas party at our house. This group of women was able to come. We did some fun things like Christmas bingo. But we were also able to share with them the message of the gospel through speaking about the meaning of Christmas. It was amazing to be able to share the best news in the world with them.”
